A *Woman Protester* prevents the steam shovel from knocking down Baby Bird's tree, but the tree is shaken and Baby Bird falls out of her nest.

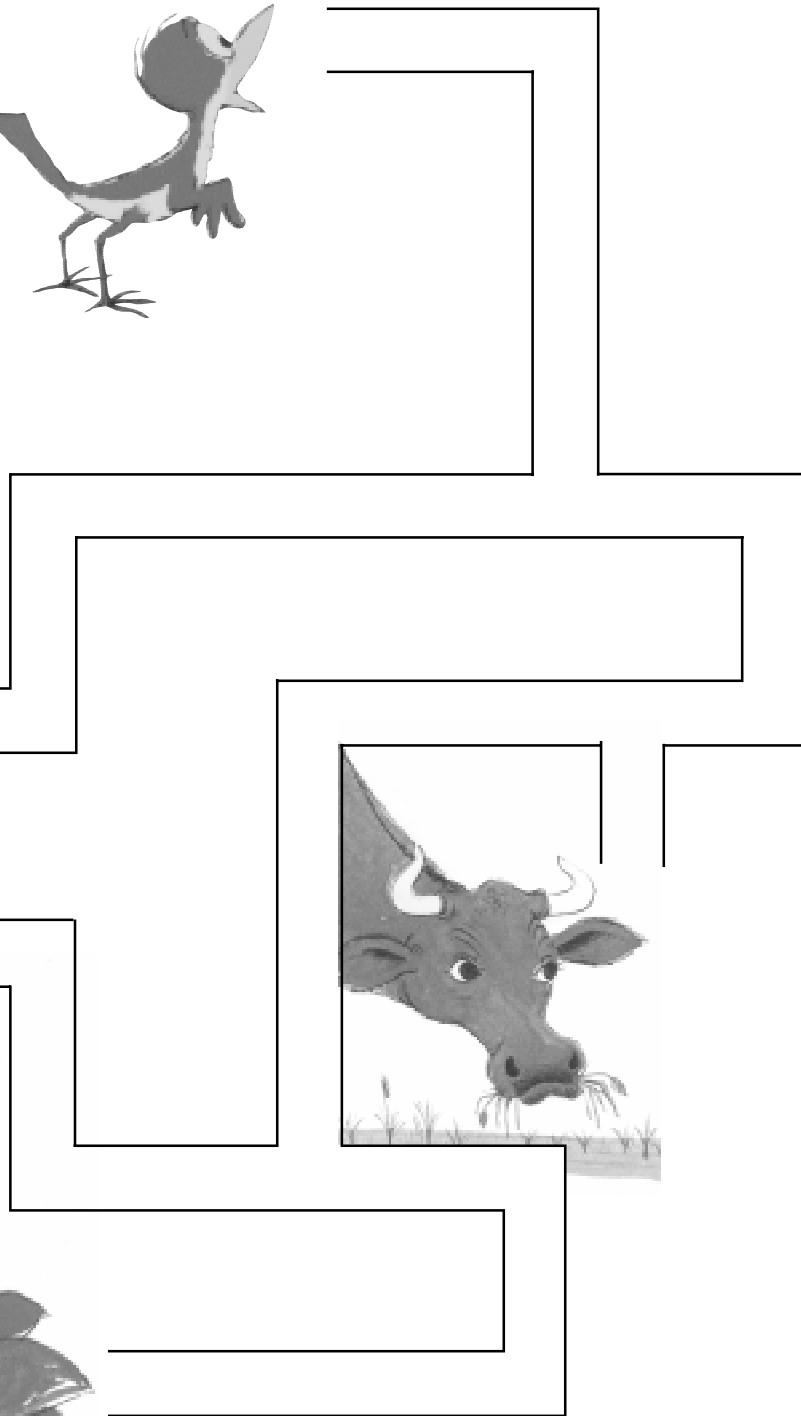
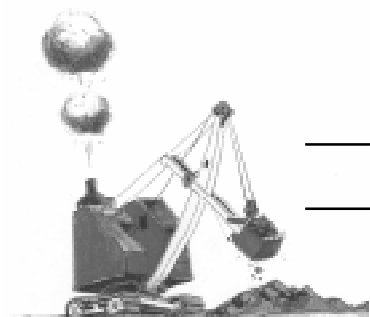
Alone, just out of the egg, Baby Bird is lost in all senses of the word. She only knows one thing: she must find her mother.

Can you be Baby Bird's friend and help her find the way to Mother Bird?

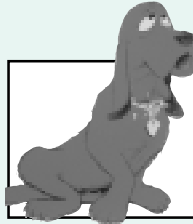
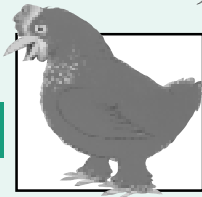


The Big Story

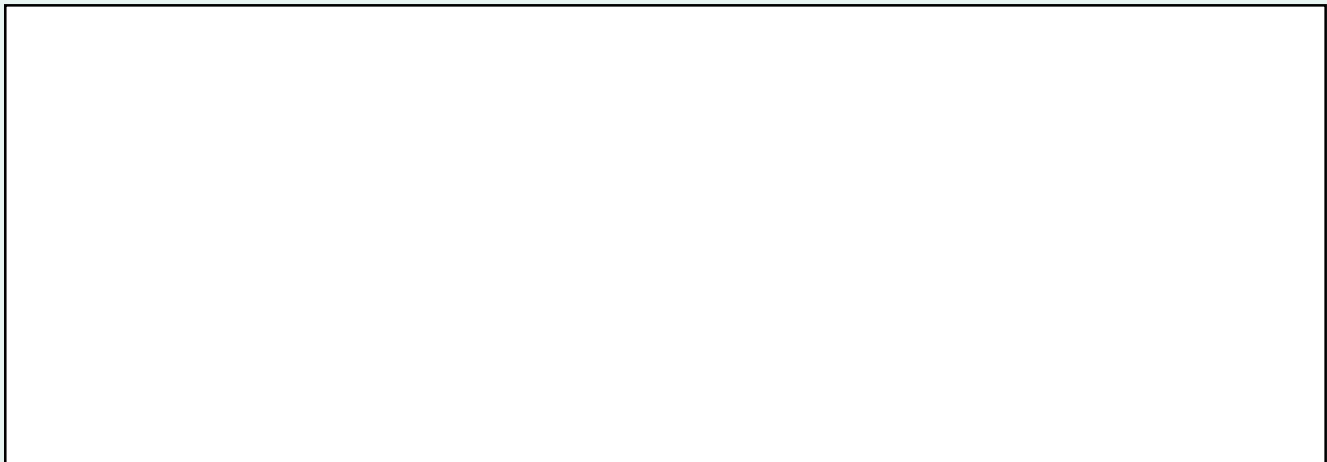
